

Ordering Your TBird Midwest Club Name Badge

Members can order their custom name badges using the procedure below. **Badges cost (\$15 each)** and must be **ordered – one at a time** (e.g., for a spouse, submit a separate order). Payment is made by credit card, and **badges will be mailed to your home**. If you have any questions, contact Cliff or reach out to Roger Boelter at rboelter@frontiernet.net or 612-483-3828.

How to Order Your Badge:

Provide the following information on the order form:

1. **First and Last Name** – As you want it to appear on the badge.
2. **Car Year and Style**
 - Use a two-digit year (e.g., '62, '04).
 - Choose the style from the dropdown: Convertible, Hardtop, Sports Roadster, or Other.
 - If selecting "Other", you can enter up to 20 custom characters.
3. **City and State** – As you'd like it printed.
4. **Upload Your Car Image** – See note below on how to prepare and upload your image.
5. **Crop Image?** – Choose "Yes" to remove the background so only your car appears (like the sample badge).
6. **Magnet Attachment?** Choose "Yes" to receive a small magnet attached to the badge and a second magnet for wearing it on clothing.
7. **Email Address** – For receiving a confirmation after submitting your order.
8. **Mailing Address** – Where your badge will be shipped.
9. **Credit Card Information** – Be sure to enter your correct billing ZIP code to process payment.
10. **Click Submit** – You're done!

Notes – Badges will be mailed directly to your home

Car Style and Year

What you enter for "Car Year and Style" will be printed exactly as typed (e.g., '67 Convertible).

Uploading Your Car Photo

You can browse and upload a photo from your PC, iPad, or tablet. If you took a photo on your smart-phone, email it to yourself and save it to your device. Then click "Browse" on the order form to attach it.

Need help? If you don't have computer access, you can send a physical photo of your car to me and I'll assist you with the order.
